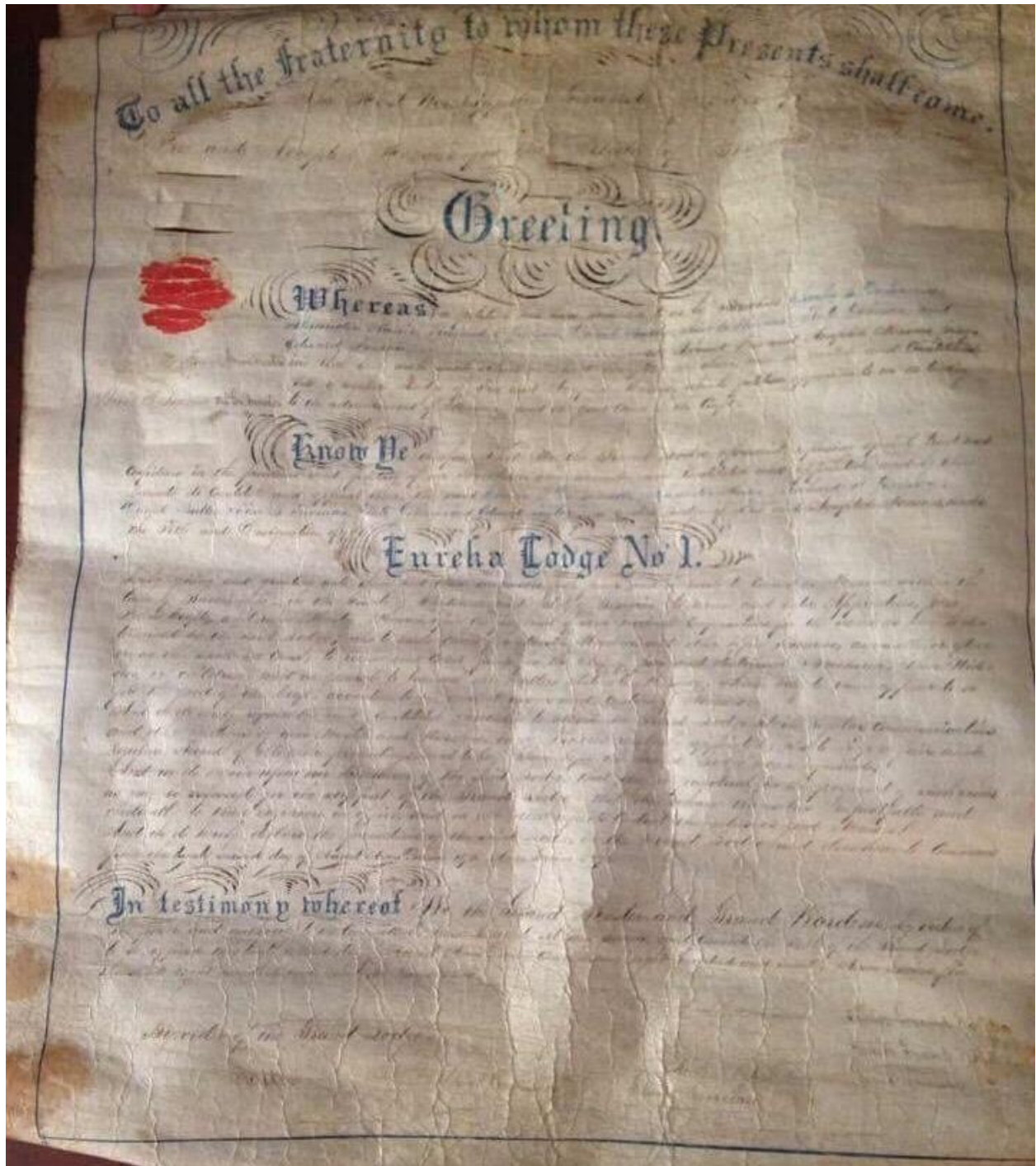




This is the original charter for Banneker Lodge #38 which is now Banneker Lodge #3. Banneker Lodge, named after Benjamin Banneker, was the 3<sup>rd</sup> lodge chartered in Georgia (Augusta) and was established on December 3, 1866 by what is now known as the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania F&AM.



This is the original charter for Eureka Lodge #1 located in Savannah, Georgia issued on August 22, 1870. Eureka Lodge is the oldest lodge amongst African Americans in the state. Over the years, Eureka Lodge's membership has included numerous influential men from the Savannah area. This lodge also holds the distinction of being the first integrated lodge in Georgia. This feat was accomplished in 1866 when Brother Miller Max, a Caucasian male, became a member. Since its inception Eureka Lodge and the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Georgia has continued this trend of practicing Universal Masonry by accepting men of all races and color.
